Thursday 12 September Corn Exchange COLD WAR

Dir. Pawel Pawlikowski Poland 2018 88 mins Filmed in black and white, this is an evocative and epic romance about a mismatched couple set in the 1950s against the backdrop of a divided Europe after World War 2 for which Pawel Pawlikowski won the best director award at Cannes in May 2018. A film greatly enhanced by "two excellent leads and its jazz score".



Thursday 26 September Corn Exchange DOGMAN

Dir. Matteo Garrone Italy 2018 103 mins

Marcello (Marcello Fonte, who won the best actor prize at Cannes for his part) is a mild mannered dog groomer who aspires to a decent life in an area corrupted by organised crime but finds his world tainted by the bullying of Simone (Edoardo Pesce) until at breaking point, he finally decides to take matters into his own hands. Some disturbing and violent scenes.

Thursday 10 October SHOPLIFTERS

Corn Exchange

Dir. Hirokazu Kore-eda Japan 2018 121 mins

Winner of the 2018 Palme d'Or at Cannes, Shoplifters is a moving and compassionate film, which explores with great delicacy and detail the notion and value of family – whether born into or chosen by circumstances and chance – and the lengths to which people will go to preserve their, sometimes fragile, connections.

Monday 14 October LEAVE NO TRACE

Dir. Debra Granik USA 2018 108 mins

An Iraqi war veteran and his young teenage daughter live a perfect but mysterious life in a beautiful nature reserve in Oregon rarely interacting with the outside world. But when a small error notifies the authorities of their existence they are launched on an increasingly erratic journey in search of a place to call their own.

Thursday 24 October Corn Exchange WAJIB

Dir. Annemarie Jacir Palestine 2017 96 mins

A low-key, sharply observed and lightly played Palestinian comedy-drama which unfolds over the course of a winter's day in Nazareth as (real-life) father and son drive around town fulfilling a tradition by delivering invitations to their daughter/sister's wedding. Filmed inside a car old tensions simmer and new ones arise gradually revealing the complexity of their relationship.



Thursday 7 November THE GUARDIANS

Corn Exchange

Dir. Xavier Beauvois France 2017 135 mins A slow moving, compassionate and beautiful, painterly period drama in which a way of life with its seasonal rhythms of sowing and reaping are minutely and sumptuously observed against the background of the horrors of the First World War. The women who have been left in the wake of history to manage a farm have their own conflict in the battle of wills between themselves.

Monday 18 November WILDLIFE

Odeon

Dir. Paul Dano USA 2018 104 mins

Set in 1960s Montana, Wildlife is a portrait of family breakdown. The compelling presence of Carey Mulligan and Jake Gyllenhaal light up this slow-burning, fiery, emotional and sexual drama whilst their teenage son grapples to understand the previously unseen flaws in his parents. It is played out against the backdrop of an uncontrolled forest fire that left to rage could engulf them all.

Thursday 28 November Corn Exchange THE GUILTY

Dir. Gustav Moller

Denmark 2018 85 mins Gustav Möller's impressive multi-awardwinning debut, The Guilty, is a master-class in wringing breathless tension from just a few key ingredients. A police officer assigned to emergency dispatch duty takes a desperate call from a kidnapped woman. In the claustrophobic setting of the emergency response rooms, the story unfolds in a series of increasingly tense phone calls, which ignite the imagination of the viewer.

Monday 2 December BEAST

Odeon

Dir. Michael Pearce UK 2017 107 mins

In an isolated community a troubled woman controlled by her family is irresistibly attracted to an unsettling outsider "by his



smell" despite him being suspected of a series of brutal murders. This accomplished debut feature by Michael Pearce, with its fairy-tale quality of being located between the domestic realm and the wild, leads the viewer down familiar paths though not necessarily to a happy ending. *Some disturbing, violent content and some sexual scenes.*



Thursday 12 December Corn Exchange THE DIVINE ORDER (+ Social)

Dir. Petra Biondina Volpe Switzerland 2017 96 mins Set in rural Switzerland in 1971 the film focuses on the collective awakening of the housewives in an alpine village and their subsequent struggle to win the right to vote. Writer-director Petra Volpe fashions a light, crowd-pleasing drama of their empowerment, which is both a celebration and a gentle reminder that sometimes it just takes one person to get the ball rolling.

Thursday 9 January Corn Exchange C'EST LA VIE

Dirs. Olivier Nakache & Eric Toledano France 2017 117mins

An incompetent wedding organiser is tasked with managing a large, high society wedding taking place in a 17th Century Chateau. Everything that can go wrong does go wrong. "The film is like a good champagne – bubbly, frothy fun with an excellent structure and a hint of complexity that leaves you on a high".

Thursday 23 January CAPERNAUM

Corn Exchange

Dir. Nadine Labaki Lebanon 2018 126 mins Labaki's Cannes jury prize-winning and Oscar nominated film is part documentary and part fictional narrative. A timely and emotionally searing story about undocumented migrants, its title, Capernaum, roughly translates as 'chaos'. Ironically it's also the name of the ancient Israeli city where Jesus performed miracles though there are no miracles in this story. It's not always easy to watch, but it is one of the most remarkable films of 2018.

Monday 3 February Odeon THE SISTERS BROTHERS

Dir. Jacques Audiard USA/France 2018 122 mins A Western set in the 1850s about two, very different, squabbling brothers who are travelling to San Francisco to kill someone. Along the way they discover things about each other that they had never before considered. Gripping, poignant and enjoyable - despite the occasional gore and violence.

Thursday 13 February Corn Exchange ASH IS PUREST WHITE

Dir. Jia Zhangke

China/France/Japan 2018 136 mins On the surface, this fascinating study of modern China spanning from 2001 - 2017 is a superb gangster drama and love story in which the director explores the past, present and future of a global superpower coming into being at an unprecedented speed. It is ravishingly photographed and utterly transporting. 'A magisterial work of epic scope'.





Thursday 27 February Corn Exchange WOMAN AT WAR

Dir. Benedikt Erlingsson Iceland/France/Ukraine 2018 101 mins This film had the highest scoring at the BFI LONDON viewings and has a captivating and idiosyncratic style as it follows environmental activist Halla working to covertly disrupt an aluminium plant by damaging power pylons, navigating her secret identity as her exploits go viral with her impending adoption of an orphaned child. Alongside the dark comedy and the theme of the despoliation of mother Earth, there is a warmth and wisdom that transcend national and cultural boundaries.

Monday 9 March OUT OF BLUE

Odeon

Dir. Carole Morley UK/USA 2018 110 mins An enigmatic thriller loosely based on a Martin Amis novel, in which a renowned astrophysicist and black hole expert Jennifer Rockwell is found dead. Detective Mike Hoolihan (Patricia Clarkson) takes on the case, but unanswered cosmic hypotheses throw everything she believes she knows into disarray as she reckons with her own past as well as the life Rockwell left behind.

Thursday 26 March STYX (+ AGM)

Dir. Wolfgang Fischer

Germany/Austria 2018 94 mins Sailing alone Rieke, a German doctor on holiday, chances upon an overloaded, damaged and drifting boat full of desperate refugees. She tries her best to help them but is eventually forced to make a life or death decision. Styx is a provocative and gripping drama, which raises complex issues of racism, empathy, western privilege and moral responsibility.
